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What are the roles of the different parts of a flower

Roots: these keep (**anchor**) the plant into the ground and **absorb** water and nutrients from the soil.

Stem: holds the plant up and carries the water and **nutrients** from the soil to the leaves.


Leaves: these make the food for the plant using sunlight and **carbon dioxide** from the air.

Flowers: these make seeds to grow into new plants. Their petals attract **pollinators** to the plant.

Nutrients: these substances are needed by living things to grow and survive. Plants get nutrients from the soil and they also make their own food in their leaves.

Evaporation: when a liquid turns into a gas.

What part do flowers play in the life cycle of flowering plants?



The flower's job is to create new seeds.

Fertilisation: When the male and female parts of the flower have mixed in order to make seeds for new plants.

Petal: The brightly coloured part of the flower that attracts insects to pollinate the plant.

Stamen: The male parts of the flower. The stamen is made up of the anther and the filament. The filament's job is to hold up the anther. The job of the anther is to make the pollen.

Carpel (pistil): The female parts of the flower. Made up of the stigma, style and ovary. The job of the style is to hold up the stigma. The stigma collects the pollen when a pollinator brushes by it. The ovary contains the ovules, which are the part of the flower that gets fertilised and eventually becomes the new seed.

sepal: Leaf-like structures that protect the flower and petals before they open out.

Pollination: When pollen (a fine powdery substance produced by a flowering plant) is moved from the male anther of a flower to the female stigma.

Pollinator: Animals or insects which carry pollen between plants. Examples include birds, bees and bats.

Germination: When a seed starts to grow.

seed dispersal: A method of moving the seeds away from the parent plant so that the seeds have the best chance of survival.

Why do animals and plants have skeletons and muscles?

Skeletons have three important jobs:

- Protect organs inside the body
- Allow movement
- Support the body and stop it from falling on the floor

What does a plant need to grow?

Plants need:

- water
- light
- air
- food

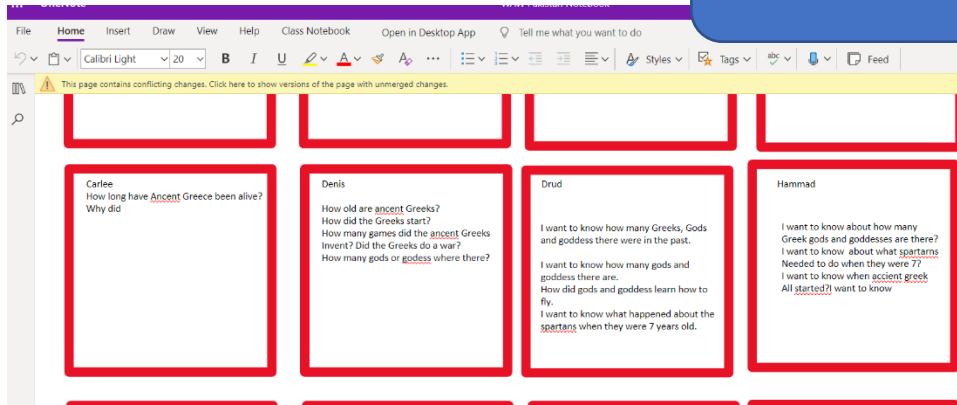





Part of the CPD strategy was to provide teachers with the skills to plan for children to not always work in books, to develop oracy, problem solving, collaboration and independence. Flipgrid has been used to record children working together on building a timeline in history.

Flipgrid shorts along with Forms, have been used here to test children's spelling knowledge. Recording the words on the Flipgrid allows the children to hear it several times as then can pause, replay. Forms allows for immediate feedback. Both of these mean the teacher has free time to work with other children.
